You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Romans 5.6-8
The Savior God provides: How Christ's death helps us.
God supernaturally – and literally – us with Christ.
If we have been united with him like this in his death, we will certainly also be united with him in his resurrection. Romans 6.5-10
